Letter from Our Board President

DEAR FRIENDS OF A STEP AHEAD CHATTANOOGA,

Despite pandemic-related challenges, 2020 was a notable year for A Step Ahead Chattanooga (ASAC). During a year when many individuals and families faced significant hardships, we were able to continue providing the information and services that ASAC has come to be known for.

As part of our strategy for providing information and access, we developed new solutions by connecting women with short-term birth control resources, began offering stand-alone removal of IUDs and implants, provided educational opportunities through Zoom, YouTube and social media, and began mailing out condom packages to individuals by request. We also opened our doors to women residing in North Georgia and North Alabama, expanding our service area to 18 counties!

Since the beginning of 2020, we have tripled our full-time staff, received national recognition as the recipient of the Clarence B. Jones Impact Award, added a comprehensive sexual health education curriculum for youth to our program offerings, and completed a federally funded educational research project. Most importantly, we have helped fill a crucial healthcare gap in our community by providing birth control services when other area providers were directing their resources elsewhere.

The need for our services remains great, especially with more women deciding to delay pregnancy or have fewer children because of the pandemic. Your contributions last year have made it possible to continue our mission to remove barriers to contraception through education, outreach, and access to free birth control. As we continue to evolve and grow, we hope you will continue to grow with us.

Despite the challenges of 2020, we were able to continue providing services thanks to our dedicated supporters. Here is a snapshot of the individuals you helped last year.



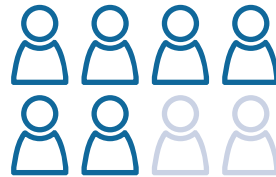

ABSTINENCE-ONLY SEX EDUCATION POLICY.

Through comprehensive sex education, we aim to empower youth with the knowledge they need and ability to make healthy choices about their bodies, health, and relationships.

125 youths

aged 13-18 were educated in the summer of 2020 with
the *Power Through Choices* sex education curriculum.

Power Through Choices is an evidence-based, trauma-informed, LGBTQ-inclusive, comprehensive sex education curriculum that covers the following topics: reproductive biology, birth control options, sexually transmitted infections, communication styles and empowerment through making positive choices.

After the success of this program in 2020, we are excited to continue offering the course in 2021.

THE CLARENCE B. JONES IMPACT AWARD.**

The award from The Communications Network, sponsored by Heinz Endowments, showcases and honors the best of what communications in the non-profit social sector looks like so that others may learn from it, recreate it, and invest more deeply in the transformative power of communications for good.

The award is named in honor of Dr. Clarence B.
